



THERAPEUTIC EURYTHMY TRAINING IN NORTH AMERICA

SCHEDULE OF TRAINING

1. June 26- July 21, 2023 (to be confirmed) / February 12-23 2024 (to be confirmed) (2 weeks)
2. June - July 2024 (5 weeks) / February 2025 (2 weeks)
3. June - July 2025 (5 weeks) / February 2026 (2 weeks - graduation)

COURSE TUITION : Total \$18,500

Tuition for first year \$6,500 (Due on or before June 26, 2023)

Tuition for second year \$6,000 (Due on or before June 24 2024)

Tuition for third year \$6,000 (Due on or before June ? 2025)

(All payments must be received in a timely manner in US Dollars in Bank Teller checks or cash)

*A month's notice of intention to withdraw from the training is requested, that is mid May.

Otherwise a payment for the coming block is required. To secure our economic stability we will not be able to reimburse tuition should you decide to withdraw mid-year.

VENUE AND ACCOMMODATION

The Camphill Village, Copake Community, is host to the Therapeutic Eurythmy Training in North America. The Village provides material, education and spiritual support for the training of Therapeutic Eurythmists. Students live in the village, and thereby join in the life of the households, work places, and festivals, to engage in the life of the village while they are present. The Village asks students to make a serious commitment to this exchange of support and interest. Camphill life is in itself a social therapeutic schooling; therapeutic eurythmy students receive credit hours for their learning experience and practice. These include participation in the living activities of the house, gardening in the vegetable, seed and healing herb gardens, and community eurythmy classes, Therapeutic Eurythmy with villagers and co-workers, as well as conversation and recreation.

If any applicant deems him/her self unable to fulfill this relationship between training and village life, it is imperative to make this clear in the application letter.

Acceptance into TETNA implies a willingness to participate in this unique relationship with the Camphill Village, Copake. This relationship has proven to be meaningful to the village community members and therapeutic eurythmy students alike.



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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The requirements for the course are given by the International Framework Curriculum for Therapeutic Eurythmy Training, with criteria developed by the international TETraining Collegium and Medical Section.

The TETNA training takes place over three years, taught in 6 blocks in a total of 20 weeks. Students must complete an observation and practical placement under the mentorship of a qualified TE.

The Diploma is awarded by the Medical Section of the Goetheanum, Dornach Switzerland, and is based on your eurythmy training diploma, awarded by the Performing Arts Section at the Goetheanum, Dornach, Switzerland.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION.

*Submission of Application form

(as the course is limited to 12 students, admission precedence will be given to those students who intend to become therapeutic eurythmists).

*Certified copy of Eurythmy Diploma

*Application fee: US \$50

COURSE REQUIREMENTS :

* Regular homework and research assignments are mandatory throughout the training.

* Students must participate in all classes and complete all assignments.

* Students must participate in two clinical practice periods, the first observational with a practicing TE, and the second working with patients with the mentorship of a TE and a physician during the latter part of the three year training period.

* All practical experiences must be fully documented and submitted to the faculty by set deadlines.

- * The faculty must receive all financial obligations and assignments before students may progress to the next block of course work.
- * Every block is concluded with a private conversation between faculty and student to share questions and challenges, to mutually recognize progress, and to support ongoing orientation and practice for further development.
- * The block of four weeks of the first summer course is viewed as a trial period. Assessment criteria are movement, participation, reliability and capacity for change.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

- * Completed course work and documented practical experiences.
- * Research paper and oral presentation with demonstration to take place during final week of course (February 2026).
- * All tuition obligations must be fulfilled.
- * Faculty approval of level of competence.

If there are valid concerns for the health of the student and their participation in the program and in the community, the faculty reserves the right to require the student to discontinue participation in the program at any time during the three-year period of training. (Tuition may not be refunded).

GRADUATION AND DIPLOMA

Upon the successful completion of all course requirements and with the recommendation of the faculty, the student will receive a diploma in Therapeutic Eurythmy, internationally recognized and endorsed by the Medical Section at the Goetheanum, Dornach, Switzerland.
