



## THERAPEUTIC EURYTHMY TRAINING IN NORTH AMERICA

### SCHEDULE OF TRAINING

1. June 29 - July 25 2026 (4wks) / February 8-20, 2027 (2 wks) \*dates to be confirmed
2. June - July 2027 (5 weeks) / February 2028 (2 weeks)
3. June - July 2028 (5 weeks) / February 2029 (2 weeks - graduation)

### COURSE TUITION : Total \$18,500

Tuition for first year \$6,500 (Due on or before June 30, 2026)

Tuition for second year \$6,000 (Due on or before June 24 2027)

Tuition for third year \$6,000 (Due on or before June ? 2028)

(All payments must be received in a timely manner in US Dollars in Bank Teller checks or cash)

\*A month's notice of intention to withdraw from the training is requested, that is mid May.

Otherwise a payment for the coming block is required. To secure our economic stability we will not be able to reimburse tuition should you decide to withdraw mid-year.

Tuition scholarships are available on application.

### VENUE AND ACCOMMODATION

The Camphill Village, Copake Community, is host to the Therapeutic Eurythmy Training in North America. The Village provides material, education and spiritual support for the training of Therapeutic Eurythmists. Students live in the village, and thereby join in the life of the households, work places, and festivals, and engage in the life of the village while they are present. As such this training is unique in the world and our students are given an immeasurable gift of rich human and therapeutic experience.

The Village asks students to make a serious commitment to this exchange of support and interest. Camphill life is in itself a social therapeutic schooling and therapeutic eurythmy students receive credit hours for their learning experience and practice in the village. These include participation in the living activities of the house, gardening in the vegetable, seed and healing herb gardens, and holding community eurythmy classes, also in therapy houses, with villagers and co-workers. If any applicant deems him/her self unable to fulfill this relationship between training and village life, please make this clear in your application letter.



## THERAPEUTIC EURYTHMY TRAINING OF NORTH AMERICA

### COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The requirements for the course are given by the International Framework Curriculum for Therapeutic Eurythmy Training, with criteria developed by the international Eurythmy Therapy Training Collegium and Medical Section.

The TETNA training takes place over three years, taught in 6 modules in a total of 20 weeks. Years 1 and 2 provide development and experience through the primary exercises of consonants, vowels and sequences. Medical studies begin with Goethean observation of plants, the human being, embryology, human development, anatomy and physiology, pathology and health, and Anthroposophical medicine. Year 3 covers specialty eurythmy: Social Therapy, eurythmy therapy for the eye, neurology, psychiatry, women's health/gynecology, infancy, the school-child, geriatrics.

All modules study the Eurythmy Therapy Lectures given by Rudolf Steiner, including 'The Invisible Man,' and other relevant course material.

The Diploma is awarded by the Medical Section of the Goetheanum, Dornach Switzerland, and is based on your eurythmy training diploma, awarded by the Performing Arts Section at the Goetheanum, Dornach, Switzerland.

### REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION.

\* Submission of Application form

(as the course is limited to 12 students, admission precedence will be given to those students who intend to become therapeutic eurythmists).

\* Certified copy of Eurythmy Diploma

\* Application fee: US \$50



### COURSE REQUIREMENTS :

- \* Regular homework and research assignments are mandatory throughout the training.
- \* Students must participate in all classes and complete all assignments.
- \* Students must complete two mentorships under the guidance of a qualified Eurythmy Therapist: 1. an observational and practical placement - practicing with 2 patients (approx. 2 months); 2. in final year, a placement/internship through a period of 6 months in practice with a minimum of 10 patients. 2 patient reports from each placement are required for graduation.
- \* All practical experiences must be fully documented and submitted to the faculty by set deadlines.
- \* The faculty must receive all financial obligations and assignments before students may progress to the next block of course work.
- \* Each module is concluded with a private conversation between faculty and student to share questions and challenges, to mutually recognize progress, and to support ongoing orientation and practice for further development.
- \* The first module of four weeks of the first summer course is viewed as a trial period. Assessment criteria are movement, participation, reliability and capacity for change.
- \* If there are valid concerns for the health of the student and their participation in the program and in the community, the faculty reserves the right to require the student to discontinue participation in the program at any time during the three-year period of training.

### REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

- \* Completed course work and documented practical experiences.
- \* Research paper and oral presentation with demonstration to take place during final week of course (February 2029).
- \* All tuition obligations must be fulfilled. Tuition scholarships are available on application.
- \* Faculty approval of level of competence.

### GRADUATION AND DIPLOMA

Upon the successful completion of all course requirements and with the recommendation of the faculty, the student will receive a diploma in Therapeutic Eurythmy, internationally recognized and endorsed by the Medical Section at the Goetheanum, Dornach, Switzerland.
